

Adjunct Teaching at Columbia University School of Social Work

Dear ABCT Colleagues,

I'm helping our Associate Dean reach out for adjuncts to teach in the second year of our clinical 2-year MSW program. We offer 7-week mini-electives or full semester courses. Classes meet once per week for 110 minutes. Clinical courses are, of course, evidence-based, skills focused and cannot presume foundational CBT knowledge. Courses meet Spring semester, Summer sessions, and Fall.

Courses I would personally love to see taught include:

Behavioral Analysis

Behavioral Interventions

Behavioral Activation

Fundamentals of CBT

Fundamentals of CT

Additionally, courses that address particular disorders are always welcome, e.g., anxiety, eating, substance abuse (we have depression, and suicide covered),

Of course, students are hungry for more DBT electives (Intro to, DBT skills, DBT with adolescents, so if you are a certified (or near certified) DBT clinician, please consider teaching in that track.

If you're interested, send me an email and your CV, letting me know what you're interested in teaching. In the interests of full disclosure I have influence, but not sole decision-making about course offerings.
