Full Time Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Clinical Psychology specializing in OCD and Bipolar Disorder: We have an opening for September 2017 for a candidate with an interest in cultivating specialized clinical skills in the areas of Obsessive Compulsive Disorder and Bipolar Disorder to be a part of multidisciplinary and quickly growing Adult Outpatient Psychiatry Centers at Zucker Hillside Hospital (on the border of Queens and Nassau, Long Island, NY) in the Northwell Health System. The fellowship offers the opportunity for trainees to become familiar with and specialize in evidence-based approaches for the treatment of these conditions. The postdoctoral fellow is responsible for the care of patients in the OCD Center and Bipolar Center using Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) (with emphasis on exposure and response prevention) for OCD/BDD/OCPC and Interpersonal and Social Rhythm Therapy and CBT for bipolar disorder. Along with individual cases, the postdoctoral fellow will run groups in both Centers using the same treatment modalities. The fellow's training experience will include weekly didactic meetings covering topics relevant to the Centers as well as professional development. Roles will include supervised clinical and administrative duties with additional opportunities to work on research projects if desired. This is a one year fellowship position with the option of a second year. The fellowship will fulfill criteria for the postdoctoral year of experience necessary for Psychology licensure. Prerequisites: Candidates must have completed the doctorate in psychology and be eligible for the NYS Limited Permit in Psychology. Ideal candidates will have experience with evidence-based treatments in the areas of mood and anxiety disorders as well as strong organizational skills.
